Inviting reference to letter No.-BSU(UGC)-02/2023-649/GS(I), dated-09.05.2023 of this Secretariat vide which opinion / comments as well as objections if any, on the Draft Ordinance & Regulations for the Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce (Honours ) 4-Year Programme Under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the Universities of Bihar was invited.

The Hon'ble Chancellor after due consideration of the opinion / comments received from the Universites and considering the advice of the Committees constituted by the Hon'ble Chancellor in this regard, has been pleased to approve the Ordinance and Regulations for the Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce (Honours) 4-Year Programme under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per UGC Regulation (Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes) for its introduction in the Universities of Bihar under relevant provisions of the Bihar State Universities Act, 1976, Patna University Act, 1976, Nalanda Open University Act, 1995 and Aryabhatta Knowledge University Act, 2008 as amended up-to-date (copy enclosed).

These Ordinance and Regulations shall supersede the existing Ordinance and Regulations of Under-Graduate courses i.e. Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce (Honours ) of different Universities in the State of Bihar from the session 2023-2027 onwards.

ORDINANCE & REGULATIONS FOR THE BACHELOR OF ARTS/SCIENCE/COMMERCE (HONOURS) CBCS SYSTEM AS PER UGC REGULATION (CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES)

4- Year PROGRAMME UNDER CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (C.B.C.S.)

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#### **Ordinance for Admission**

- 1. This ordinance shall be known as "Ordinance for Admission" in the Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce for the Universities of Bihar including Patna University under CBCS System.
- 2. The under graduate programmes shall be undertaken in eight Semesters spread over four years.
- 3. It will come into effect from the Academic Session 2023-2024.
- 4. The eligibility criterion for admission in Bachelor's programmes are listed in Table 1.

5. For the Current session 2023-24, University wise admission shall be made on the basis of marks obtained at 10+2 level by the Universities of Bihar including Patna University.

From the next academic year for all Universities of Bihar, admission to the first semester of the Bachelor programme shall be made, on unified basis, on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate at 10+2 level or Common Admission Entrance Test (CAET), as decided by the Chancellor.

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6. The Admission Entrance Test Booklet will consist of 100 multiple-choice type questions. The Part A of the Admission Entrance Test Booklet will consist of 40 multiple choice type questions from General Knowledge, General Aptitude and Numerical Aptitude.

The Part-B will consist of 60 multiple-choice type questions from all major subjects of Humanities and Social Science.

The Part- C will consist of 60 multiple-choice type questions from all major subjects of science (For Science Stream only).

The Part D will consist of 60 multiple-choice type questions from all major subjects of Commerce.

Part A of the Admission Entrance Test Booklet will be common for all and students may choose any <u>one</u> from Part B, Part C and Part D. There will be a Common merit list and students shall have the option to choose the programme from the list offered by the University. Students shall fill in their choices. Finally, the programme will be allotted on the basis of their merit cum choice. The duration of the test shall be of two hours.

7. The candidate seeking admission shall have to apply online on the University web portal after paying the requisite fee mentioned in the advertisement notice published by the University. The candidate shall have to upload the documents supporting his/her claim mentioned in the application from.

**Note**: No applicant shall be admitted to the programme who has not applied for admission within the notified period.

8. Fee structure: The breakup of fees per semester is given in Table 2.

- ❖ Lab fee Rs. 600/- per semester for the subject having practical classes (Science, Geography, Psychology, Home Science, Music)
- ❖ Field Visit- Actual expenditure at the time of field visit to be paid by the student.
- ❖ Every Student has to be registered after getting admission any programme by paying Rs. 600 and it will be called Univ. Registration.
- ❖ Examination Fees will be Rs. 600/- (Six hundred rupees) in each semester which will be paid by the students at the time of filling of Examination Form.
- The revision of the fee structure may be made every 4<sup>th</sup> year on the approval of the Chancellor.

- ❖ Fee for UG Certificate / UG Diploma / UG Degrees / UG Degrees Honours with research will be rupees Rs. 600/-(Six hundred) per each.
- Society fund will be used for different student clubs.

#### Reservation


The reservation of seats in the Bachelor programme shall be made in terms of the reservation rules approved by the Government of Bihar.

- 9. In case any document submitted by a candidate at the time of admission to this programme is/are found to be fake, the admission of the candidate shall stand cancelled, and the fee deposited by the candidate will also be forfeited.
- 10. Any candidate can be denied admission, or his/her name will be struck off from the roll of the University if it is required in the best interest of the University.
- 11. The candidates shall not be allowed to register for any other degree programme in the same University or any other University during the same academic session of his/her study in the Bachelor or any other equivalent programme.
- 12. Any student who attended all courses/papers in a Semester as a regular student and sent up for the End Semester Examination (ESE) but fails to appear in the ESE shall have to appear in the subsequent forthcoming examination of a particular semester by paying the requisite examination fee.
- 13.A student who has less than 75% attendance in any course/paper, will be required to repeat the particular course/paper in the subsequent forthcoming examination by paying the proportionate fee of that semester as per decision of the University.
- 14. Every student has to be registered before the start of next semester and it will be called Semester registration.
- 15. Minor changes in the Ordinance and Regulation may be made by the Academic Council if required in the interest of academics.
- 16. The general ordinance of the University shall cover any aspect not covered in the present ordinance.

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
#### **Regulations for Examination**

- 1.1. These regulations should be called the "Regulation of Examination" for the 04-Year UG programme of Universities of Bihar under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Curriculum.
- 1.2. It shall come into force from the Academic Year 2023-2024.
- 1.3. The B.A. (Hons) program shall come under the "Faculty of Arts", B.Sc. (Hons) under "Faculty of Science" and B.Com. (Hons) under "Faculty of Commerce".
- 2. OUTLINE OF THE CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS): It shall consists of following courses, Major Course (MJC), Minor Course (MIC), Multidisciplinary Course (MDC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), Value Added Course (VAC), Ability Enhancement Course (Course on Disaster Risk Management) (AEC), Internship (INT), Research Project (RP) / Dissertation.

#### The nature of these courses is as defined below:

Major Course (MJC): Major (MJC) courses are designed to impart students with the core concepts, principles and processes, and laboratory as well as instrumental skills in main branches. MJCs are a mandatory requirement for a student's program of study who wish to pursue an undergraduate degree. MJCs will be appropriately graded and arranged across the semesters of study, being undertaken by the student, with multiple entry and exit options as per UGC Curriculum.

Minor Course (MIC): The growth of specific subject in the past few decades have been tremendous and many new sub-disciplines have emerged. It is important that apart from the main branches of the subject, a study of these new branches is also included in the curriculum. The Minor Course (MIC) incorporates important emerging areas and a pool of credit courses from their own faculty are included out of which a student will choose to study, based on his/her interest from their own faculty.



Multidisciplinary Course (MDC): Multi-Disciplinary Courses are a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. Students may opt for any three Multidisciplinary course out of a list of Multidisciplinary papers (Basket) offered by the parent department or any other department/s as per his/her choice with the prior permission of the parent department. The list of Multidisciplinary papers, syllabus and prerequisite of the Multidisciplinary courses will be as decided by the Board of Studies (BOS) of the concerned subject /department / Academic Council.

**Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)**: SEC are skill-based courses in all disciplines and are aimed at providing hands-on training, competencies, proficiency and skills to students. SEC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide skill-based instruction.

Value-Added Course (VAC): This is a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters out of which a student can choose. VAC courses are the common pool of courses offered by different disciplines and aimed towards personality building, embedding ethical, cultural & constitutional values; promoting critical thinking, Indian Knowledge Systems, scientific temperament, communication skills, creative writing, presentation skills, sports & physical education and teamwork which will help in the all-round development of students.

Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): AEC courses are courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement through various areas of study. They are Language and Literature, Environmental Science and Sustainable Development which are mandatory for all disciplines.

# 3. Program of Study / Course Structure:

- 3.1. Students shall undergo a certified program of study extending up to eight semesters spread over four academic years.
- 3.2. Each academic year shall consist of two semesters: Odd semesters (I, III, V, VII) from July to December Even semesters (II, IV, VI, VIII) from January to June.
- 3.3. The Bachelor programme will consist of a number of courses as per Annexure, spanning over eight semesters.
- 3.4. For running miner courses in a particular semester the academic Council of the University may take the decision if required keeping the viability at the local level.

- 3.5. To maintain Uniform academic accountability, certain weightage is assigned in the form of "Credit", separately for each course per semester depending upon the length of the Curriculum. A minimum of 10 hours of teaching has been fixed for each credit as on average.
- 3.6. The Bachelor programme shall have 160 credits altogether. The CGPA shall be awarded on the candidate's performance in all papers/courses.
- 3.7. The syllabus of the programme may be revised as per the demand of different stakeholders by BOS and will be duly approved by the Academic Council.
- 4. UG Courses offered by SWAYAM/MOOC related to MDC and Skill enhancement, not studied as core course/paper may be selected by the candidate with the approval of the Department.
  - Students undertaking UG course from SWAYAM/MOOC shall be eligible for credit transfer if he/she gets a certificate for successful completion from SWAYAM.
- 5. Evaluation of Performance Under C.B.C.S.
  - 5.1 Any student admitted to Bachelor programme and registered in the University shall be eligible to appear in the University Examination for each Semester only after securing 75% attendance both in theory and practical classes separately and was also passed in all CIA.



- 5.2 The University Examination of each course in all semesters shall have two components:
- i. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) of MJC, MIC, MDC, AEC & SEC containing 30 marks.
- ii. End Semester Examination (ESE) of MJC, MIC, MDC AEC & SEC, <u>VAC</u> containing 70 marks.
  - Components of CIA (For theory course):
    - i. One mid-semester written tests (1x15) = 15 marks
    - ii. Seminar/Quiz/Presentation/Assignment = 10 marks
    - iii. Attendance and conduct = 05 marks
      - Total = 30 marks
  - Components of CIA (For practical course):
    - i. One mid-semester written tests (1x15) = 15 marks
    - ii. Seminar/Quiz/Presentation/Assignment = 10 marks
    - iii. Attendance and conduct = 05 marks
      Total = 30 marks
- 5.3 The CIA component of the Examination shall be conducted by the department under the concerned teacher of the course/paper. He/ She will be responsible for the submission of CIA marks after evaluation to the Head of the Department.
- 5.4 Only the End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be conducted by the University. For the theory courses / papers of 3 credits or more, there shall be a written examination of 3 hours duration. For theory papers of less than 3 credits, there shall be ESE of two hours duration. However, the ESE of Practical and Project Dissertation viva-voce shall be conducted in the respective department.
- 5.5 The evaluation of the Project Dissertation will also be based on CIA and the end-semester examination.
- 5.6 All such examinations shall be as per the provisions of the Examinations Board.
- 6. Examinations
- 6.1 The End-semester-Examination will be conducted by the University.

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#### Question Paper Pattern will be uniform for all Universities of Bihar.

- 6.2 The candidate's performance in the examination for the Bachelor programme shall be evaluated following the Uniform Grading System (Credits) formulated on the guidelines of UGC for the computation of Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).
- 6.3 The examination of odd semester I, II, V and VII shall generally be held in November and December and that of even semesters II, IV, VI and VIII in the month of April-May.
- 6.4 Paper Setting and Evaluation: For ESE, the paper setting and evaluation will be done by the teachers of the concerned subject.
- 6.5 The question papers for all courses of (i) AEC (ii) SEC & (iii) VAC will be of OMR based objective type.
- 7. Passing of Examinations and Promotional Rules:
- 7.1 There shall be no supplementary examination in any of the courses/papers in any semester.
- 7.2 The candidates who have been admitted to the First Semester of a four-year Undergraduate Programme in a session can be placed in the following categories based on their attendance in the Semester and performance in CIA.
- i. Those who have cleared the CIA and attended the required minimum percentage (75%) of attendance shall appear in the ESE.
- ii. Those who have not attended the required minimum percentage of attendance (75%) and not cleared CIA shall in no case be permitted to appear in the End Semester Examination.
- 7.3 After appearing at the End Semester Examination, the candidates can be placed in the following categories in the context of the declaration of the Semester Examination results.
- i. To be declared passed in End Semester Examination; a candidate must secure at least a 'P' grade as mentioned in Table-4 in each course/paper (including CIA and ESE).
- ii. A candidate may be promoted to next semester based on the following criteria as given in Table-3.

2.	From Semester-II to Semester-III	Attended all courses in Semester-I and Semester II as a regular student and sent up** for the Semester-II examination.  The candidate must earn at least 28 credits of Semester-I and II taken together in MJC MIC, MDC, AEC & VAC.

4.	From Semester-IV to Semester-V	Attended all courses in Semester-IV as a regular student and sent up** for the Semester-IV examination.  The candidate must earn total credit of I & II Semester & also at least 68 credits of Semester-I, II, III and IV taken together in MJC, MIC, MDC, AEC, SEC and VAC.
5.	From Semester-V to Semester-VI	Attended all courses in Semester-V as regular student and sent up** for th Semester-V examination.
6	From Semester-VI to Semester-VII	Attended all courses in Semester-VI as regular student and sent up** for the Semester-VI examination. The candidat must earn total credit of III & IV Semester & also at least 108 credits taken together in MJC, MIC, MDC, AEC, SEC, VAC and Internship.
7.	From Semester VII to Semester-VIII	Attended all courses in Semester-VII as a regular student and sent up** for the Semester-VII examination.

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- \*\* Sent up for End Semester Examination here refers to those candidates who have a minimum of 75% attendance in each course/paper separately.
- i. Candidates shall have to clear their backlog course/paper (s) in the subsequent end-semester examination of that semester whenever it is available.
- ii. The Final result will be published only after he/she has cleared all 160 credits and three more academic years can be given to clear all 160 credits.
- iii. Since it is a continuous evaluation programme, a student shall be awarded Semester Grade Points (SGPA) at the end of the first-semester Examination, and in the subsequent semesters till the fifth semester, and finally, in the sixth Semester the result will be awarded based on CGPA. No grade points will be awarded if there is any backlog present.
- The promoted candidate/candidates will not be iv. awarded any SGPA/CGPA till he/she clears all the backlogs.
- A promoted candidate, he/she fails in ESE, he/she shall retain his/her V. CIA score and will reappear in the ESE only of the semester whenever available.
- Students undertaking any UG course from SWAYAM.MOOC as SEC or vi. MDC shall be eligible for credit transfer if he/she gets a certificate for successful completion from SWAYAM/MOOC.
- The candidate must clear the programme within maximum of seven vii. years. Academic Council may give one additional year of relaxation in case of exceptional circumstances.

## **Note:-Special Provision:**

Case of serious health problems and other strictly unavoidable circumstances, relaxation in required attendance might be condoned up to a maximum 15%.

#### 8. Declaration of Result:

The Teacher/Examination Department shall use the following grading system: Result in the form of grade points consequent upon evaluation will be awarded in the following two manners-

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- I. At the end of each semester which will be titled as Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA).
- II. At the end of the programme, which will be titled Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). The explanations for publishing results in the form of Grade points is given in Table-5.

The grading system stated below shall be used at the time of preparation of the result of the candidates who appeared at the examination.
